Going back to Lehigh Valley again this year, but downtown Allentown this year on July 22nd. And then we're headed up to Williamsport, somewhere I used to go to school up near there, and doing a Disability Pride Williamsport CILebration with the Roadster Freedom CIL up there. And then we'll kick off our Disability Pride Pittsburgh event on 8/24. Going back again to Schenley Plaza where we had such a blast last year. And then of course, rounding out this year we're going to be doing Disability Pride Philadelphia, our favorite, our favorite event the one that's been going on the longest and we are partying on the Parkway again. So it's very exciting.

And we're hoping to get folks excited about Disability Pride up in that area. And also, we're celebrating, you know, we've partnered with PA Inclusive, which is an organization that does a lot, a lot of amazing work. And they're actually celebrating their 10 year anniversary, so we're gonna get to celebrate with them.
